Summary Analysis & Consensus	What are the elements of a summary ? Let's read Mr. Tim's example summary and discuss the elements. <u>Model summary</u> → whole group mini-lesson and consensus (<u>semantic map</u>)	When we <i>summarize</i> , we sum, or tell a story with a main idea and details.
Summary Organizer - Overview	What are the elements of a summary ? Let's review some of the language that can help us create a well-organized summary.	Sequencing language can help us organize our thinking and connect our main idea to details.
